OUR STRIKE PROGRAMME STOOD VINDICATED- POSSIBLE SETTLEMENT REACHED

You are aware that the Postal Board attempted to destroy the RMS and MMS entity for the last one year. 85 RMS offices (deals less than 10000 articles) were closed. (Target is 101).

One RMS Division viz., 'P' Dn. Patna was merged with RMS 'PT' Dn.

5 R.Os were closed arbitrarily.

66 RMS sections were abolished.

The Secretary, Posts sent D.O. letter to all Heads of Circles to close/merge the RMS night sets, abolish sections within circle, close/merge the RMS offices which deal with more than 10000 articles. If D.O. letter of the Secretary, Posts is implemented, that will be the last nail on the RMS. In order to avoid this, the RMS service unions proposed to launch indefinite strike from 15-12-2009.

Strike Intimation letter was served to the Department on 29-10-2009 by both the Federations and RMS unions.

Strike programme was started from 9-11-2009 to 11-11-2009 at Branch levels, from 13-11-2009 at Divisional level, from 20-11-2009 at Circle level.

The CHQ office bearers started strike tour from 16-11-2009.

On seeing the hectic preparation of the strike by RMS JCA, the Directorate convened meeting on 27-11-2009.

NEGOTIATION STARTED

On 27-11-2009, the Negotiation meeting was chaired by Smt. Manjula Parasher, Member (O). The staff side argued effectively with the officers. We questioned the Department if the reorganization takes place as planned, whether public will get their letter delivered within 24 hours. The officers were unable to reply. We strongly protested the D.O. letter of the Secretary, Posts addressed to the Heads of Circles. The meeting ended without any lasting solution after 3 ½ hours and decided to meet next day.

On 28-11-2009, the meeting was chaired by Member (O). She agreed in principle that the RMS offices which deal with more than 10000 articles would not be closed. But she was not ready to give any commitment on the following issues:

- i) merger/closure of night sets
- ii) merger of RMS Divisions
- iii) abolishing sections within circles
- iv) closure of R.Os
- v) merger of SROs with Post Offices

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The Staff side demanded that no re-organisation as planned by the Department should take place from that date (28-11-2009).

The chairperson was not in a position to give reply on behalf of the Department. The meeting ended without any solution after 3 ½ hours.

MEETING WITH THE CHAIRMAN, POSTAL BOARD

On 30th November 2009, the Secretary, Department of Posts, Ms. Radhika Doraiswamy chaired the meeting. The staff side demanded that no reorganization should take place from 30th Nov. 2009 onwards. After detailed discussion, the Secretary agreed to stop the re-organisation for the time-being. She assured that

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Department of Posts has been very badly neglected and it needs technological developments. Further, all the technological developments would be meaningful if there is adequate volume of mails. The Chairperson informed the staff side about the integration of the Post Offices as a result of which the entire back post offices work will be taken away from the Post Offices. The Chairperson further stated that the entire structural re-organisation is being planned with the ultimate objective of making Department of Posts as one of the best postal Administrations in the world, for which the staff side has to extend their cooperation with an open mind. In the matter of RMS the staff side was informed of the engagement of a consultant with an assurance to the staff side that one of their representatives would also be on board in discussions with Mail Consultant and would be able to contribute his ideas/views towards the restructuring of mail net work.

4. In the matter of merger of SROs with the Head Post Offices taken as item No. 1 in the Charter of Demands, the Chairperson stated that it is a suggestion from the Postmaster General and no action would be taken on it till such time the Mail Consultant considers the structure re-organisation of the entire system, in which as mentioned in para above the staff side will also have a representation. The Chairperson also referred to the presentations/seminars work-

one committee will be formed to study the proposed re-organisation with experts (probably from German Post).

Agreement was reached to defer the strike.

Possible settlement reached

The RMS unions and Federations advocated vehemently against the re-organisation. But the present settlement reached is not a permanent measure. The real attack may be started by the Department within a few months. To avoid confrontation now, the unions proposed the present settlement.

I call upon rank and file be ready for real confrontation in the days to come.

shops to be organized in connection with the consultant working on the functioning of the mail system.

5. Regarding merger of RMS offices having 10000 or more mails, further to the discussions held on 28-11-09, the staff side mentioned about the review of 2 RMS offices in Kolkata having more than 10000 mails namely Bandel and Barasat, which were ordered to be closed. The Chairperson made it clear that status quo as on date will be maintained. However Department would request CPMG West Bengal to have a look at the figures once again to ensure that the ceiling of less than 10000 articles is followed in spirit. This has been done on the suggestion from staff side.

6. In the matter of merger of CRCs at Chennai, it was explained that adequate infrastructure will be provided to make the merger practical. This was agreed by the staff side. As far Chennai PSO (functioning in AP building) and Tenkasi sorting is concerned, status quo will be maintained as on 30-11-2009. Due to paucity of time, other items could not be discussed in the meeting of Secretary and it was decided that these items would be discussed in a subsequent meeting to be taken up by Member (O).

7. The staff side expressed their satisfaction over the discussions and conveyed their decision not to issue a notice of strike.

8. The Meeting ended with the vote of thanks to the Chair.

GOVT. ORDERS

Imposing if statutory punishment for non-performance of OT Duty.

D.G. Posts No. 2/6/2009-SR Dated 26-10- 2009

I am directed to refer to the Department's letter No. 2-4/2005-SR (I) dated 16-6-2006 dealing with the above mentioned subject.

2. In a periodical meeting of Secretary (Posts) with Federations on 4-1-2004, an agenda item "Imposing of statutory punishments for non-performances of OT Duty" was discussed, the staff side contended that on one hand, payment of over time Allowance to the officials was being delayed badly and on the other hand, the officials who expressed their inability to perform over time were being imposed statutory punishments.

As per decision taken in the said meeting, all the concerned were instructed that imposing of statutory punishment for no performance of over time duty should be restored to in rare and exceptional circumstances.

3. Complaints are still being received from staff side alleging impositions of statutory punishment for non performance of over time. This issue has been included as one of the agenda item to be discussed in Secretary (P)'s periodical meeting with the unions. It has, therefore, become imperative to reiterate the instructions issued to the Department vide letter No. 204/2005-SR (I) dated 16-6-2006 for compliance in letter and spirit. Receipt of this letter may please be acknowledged.

Use of car/hired taxi on LTC journey on account of physical handicap.

**DOP & T OM No. F.No. 3101113/2009-Estt.(A)
Dated the 28th Oct. 2009**

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department's O.M. No. 3101114/2008-

Estt. (A) dated 23-9-2008 in which it was stipulated that LTC facility shall be admissible only in respect of journeys performed in vehicles operated by the Government or any corporation in the public sector run by the Central or State Government or a local body.

2. Instances have come to notice where Government servants on account of physical handicap/disability of self or dependant family members are unable to perform the LTC journey by the authorized modes of transport and are compelled to undertake the journey by own car or private taxi. Representations are being received to allow reimbursement in such cases. Matter has been examined in consultation with, the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure and it has been decided in relaxation of LTC Rules to authorize the Head of Department to allow use to own/hired taxi for LTC journey on account of disability of the Government servant or dependant family member after obtaining following papers/conditions to avoid misuse of such relaxation.

- i) Medical Certificate from competent authority.
- ii) Undertaking from Government servant that journey in authorized mode is not feasible and he actually traveled by own car/hired taxi.
- iii) Such claim should not be more than journey performed by the entitled.

3. Hindi Version will follow.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare OM F.No. 39-3/2003-04/CGHS/MSD/RS dated 23-7-2009 read with corrigendum of 3-8-2009.

Sub : Non-admissibility of preparation such as primarily food, tonics cosmetics and vaccines.

The undersigned is directed to say that the question of admissibility or otherwise to beneficiaries under CGHS/CS(MA) Rules 1944 of preparations which are primarily food, vitamins, Haematinic minerals, antioxidants, cosmetics and vaccines, has been under consideration for some time. On the recommendations of an Expert Committee and Drug Controller General of India, it has been decided that:

- i) Product manufactured/ marketed as food supplement, cosmetics and ayurvedic preparation prescribed by allopathic doctors will be inadmissible.
- ii) Supply of vitamins, minerals and anti-oxidants will be restricted to prevalent CGHS formulary only.

- iii) Vaccines, in general, will be inadmissible, except Hepatitis B, Influenza and Leprovac Vaccines for high risk individual, is recommended by specialist with justification and countersigned by HOD of concerned speciality of Government Hospital.

These instructions take effect from the dated of issue of the Office Memorandum.

Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare OM No. 1/15/2008-P & PW(E) dated 17th August, 2009.

Sub : Family Pension - Extension of the scope of Family Pension to the dependent disabled siblings (i.e. brothers/sisters) of Central Government Servants/Pensioners - Reg.

The undersigned is directed to say that as per the existing provisions in Rule 54(14) of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, read with various orders/instructions issued by this Department in this regard from time to time, the following are presently covered in the definition of 'family' in relation to a Government servant/Pensioner for the purpose of eligibility for family pension :

- a) Wife in the case of a male Government servant or, husband in the case of a female Government servant.
- b) A judicially separated wife or husband, such separation not being granted on the ground of adultery and the person surviving was not held guilty of committing adultery.
- c) Son/Daughter upto the date of his/her marriage or till the date he/she starts earning, or till the age of 25 years, whichever is the earliest;
- d) Unmarried/widowed/divorced daughter, upto the date of marriage/remarriage or till the date she starts earning, whichever is earliest; and
- e) Parents who were wholly dependent upon Government servant when he/she was alive provided the deceased employee has left behind neither a widow nor a child.

Further, the dependency criteria for the purpose of family pension has been revised and fixed as the minimum family pension, alongwith the dearness relief thereon, vide this Department's OM No. 38/37/09-P & PW (A) dt. 2-9-2008.

2. Representations have been received in this Department from various quarters requesting

for extension of the scope of family pension so as to cover the dependent disabled siblings (i.e. brothers/sisters) of Government servants/pensioners within the ambit of 'family' for the purpose of eligibility of family pension. The arguments advanced by the representationists in support of their request are that the dependent disabled siblings (i.e. brothers/sisters) are left to fend for themselves after the death of the Government servant/pensioners on whom they were fully dependent before his/her death. They need to be taken care of by the society and the Government as they are helpless and without any means to manage their lives.

3. These representations have been sympathetically examined in this Department in consultation with other Ministries/ Departments concerned. It has now been decided to include the dependent disabled siblings (i.e. brothers/sisters) of Government servants/pensioners in the definition of 'family' for the purpose of eligibility for family pension. Such disabled siblings shall be eligible for family pension for life in the same manner and following the same disability criteria, as laid down in Rule 54 of the CS (Pension) Rules, 1972 in the case of son/ daughter of Government employees/ Pensioners suffering from any disorder or disability of mind (including mentally retarded) or physically crippled or disabled, so as to render him/her unable to earn a living even after attaining the age of 25 years.
4. This issues with the concurrence of Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure vide their U.O. No. 677/E-V/2008 dt. 19-2-2009.
5. These orders, in so far as their applicability relates to the employees of the Indian Audit and Accounts Department, are being issued in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India, vide their U.O. No. 69-Audit (Rules)/26-2008 dated 17-7-2009.
6. The CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 shall stand modified to that extent.

Sub : Implementation of Government's decision on the recommendations of the Sixth Central Pay Commission, Revision of Pension of Pre-2006 pensioners/family pensioners etc.

The undersigned is directed to say that in pursuance of Government's decision on the recommendations of Sixth Central Pay Commission, sanction of the President was accorded to the regulation, with effect from 1-1-2006, of pension/family pension of all the pre-2006 pensioners/family pensioners in the manner indicated in this Department's O.M. no. 38/37/08-P&PW(a) dated 1-9-2008. Clarifications on certain provisions were

also issued vide O.M. No. 38/37/08 P & PW (A) pt. I dated 3-10-2008 and 14-10-2008.

2. A concordance table of the pre-1996, pre-2006 and post 2006 pay scales/pay bands was enclosed as Annexure-1 of the OM dated 14-10-2008 to facilitate payment of revised pension/family pension in terms of para 4.2 of the OM dated 1-9-2008 (as clarified vide OM dated 3-10-2008) in all cases where fixation of pension under that provision is more beneficial. Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure), vide Notification No. 01/01/2008-IC (GSR 527 E) dated 16-7-2009 has notified revised pay scale for pre-revised S-30 scale of pay. Consequently, the entries at Sl. No. 32 in the Table at Annexure-1 of this Department's OM of even number dated 14-10-2008 shall be substituted by the following:

Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare OM F.No. 38/37/08-P&PW(A) dated 14-7-2009.

Sub : Implementation of Government's decision on the recommendations of the Sixth Central Pay Commission - Revision of pension of pre-2006 pensioners.

The undersigned is directed to say that in accordance with para 4.2 of this Department's OM No. 38/37.08-P&PW(A) dated 1-9-2008 (as clarified vide OM dated 3-10-2008 and 14-10-2008), the revised pension of pre-2006 pensioners shall, in no

case, be lower than fifty percent of the minimum of the pay in the pay band plus the grade pay corresponding to the pre-revised pay scale from which the pensioner had retired. In the case of HAG+ and above scales, this will be fifty percent of the minimum of the revised pay scale. Clarifications have been sought by Ministries/Departments as to whether Non-Practicing Allowance (NPA) is to be added to the minimum of the revised pay band plus the grade pay/revised pay scale while considering stepping up consolidated pension on 1-1-2006. The matter has been examined in consultation with the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure).

2. On implementation of the recommendations of Fifth Central Pay Commission, NPA was not added to the minimum of the revised scale of pay as on 1-1-1996 in cases where consolidated pension/family pension was to be stepped up to 50% / 30% respectively. Hon'ble Supreme Court, in its judgement dated 10-10-2006 in Transfer Case (civil) 72 of 2004 -Col. (Retd.) B.J. Akkara VS UOI &

others, upheld the validity of OM dated 11-9-2001 of Ministry of Defence not allowing the benefit of NPA in the case of retired medical officers of Armed Forces to be added to the minimum of revised scale of pay as on 1-1-1996 corresponding to the scale of pay held by the pensioner at the time of his retirement. Hon'ble Supreme Court held that NPA is not the part of minimum of the revised pay scale as on 1-1-1996.

3. NPA granted to medical officers does not form part of the Pay Bands/ scales of pay. It is a separate element, although it is taken into account for the purpose of computation of pension. It is therefore, clarified, that in the case of pre-2006 pensioners NPA is not to be added to the minimum of the revised pay band + Grade pay/revised pay scales in cases where consolidated pension/family pension as on 1-1-2006 is to be stepped upto 50% / 30% respectively, in terms of para 4.2 of Department of Pension & PW's O.M. No. 38/37/08-P&PW(A) Dated 1-9-2008 (as clarified) vide OM dated 3-10-2008 and 14-10-2008).
4. It is impressed upon all the Ministries/ Departments of the Government of India to keep in view the above clarifications while disposing of the cases of revision of pension/ family pension. They are also advised to dispose the representations received by them from pensioners on the above issues without referring them to this Department.
5. This issues with the concurrence of Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) vide their U.O. No. 264/EV/2009 Dated 9-7-2009.

**Sub : Implementation of New Pension Scheme -
Precondition for release of 2nd Instalment of
arrears of 6th CPC recommendations.**

Reference is invited to this Department's earlier Office Memorandums regarding implementation of new Pension Scheme. The progress of implementation of NPS has been reviewed and the following action needs to be taken up immediately.

- i) It has been intimated by NSDL that in a large number of cases pertaining to post 1-1-2004 entrants into Government service, the individual application forms for registration to the NPS have not been filled up and sent to them. It is therefore, advised that all

employees under the administrative control of your Ministry/Department who are covered under NPS may be asked to fill up the enclosed form (not printed) which may then be forwarded by ODD/PAO to NSDL immediately (latest by 31st August, 2009) if this has not already been done. Action in this regard will need to be completed before release of second installment of arrears for which separate orders will be issued. It may be noted that release of the 2nd instalment, for post 1-1-2004 entrants, will be subject to the above action being completed.

- ii) Further, the review has brought out that there are cases where the CDDOs/PAOs have not uploaded contribution files of (b) regular monthly credits have not been posted in the IRA or (c) there is mismatch of contribution. NSDL has been asked to forward PAO/ODD wise subscriber details which will become available to CDDOs/PAOs by the end of August, 2009. Suitable instructions may be issued to all the PAOs/CDDs to verify the details/confirm contribution/Fund Transfer circulated by NSDL. Action as prescribed by NSDL/PFRDA while circulating these details (underlying action for missing credits) may be completed positively by 30th September, 2009.

The Special meeting of the Postal Joint Council of Action was called for under the

Chairpersonship of Member (Operations) on 27-11-2009 to discuss the Charter of Demands submitted alongwith notice dated 29-10-09 for Agitational programme. Before item-wise discussion could be taken up, the staff side raised the issue of merger of certain RMS offices having 10000 or more mails, stating it to be in violation of agreement between the Department and the staff side. Referring to the D.O. letter of Secretary (Posts) to the Heads of Circles regarding review of establishment, the staff side expressed on apprehension that it was a direction to the Heads of Circles for closure of mail offices/ Section sets etc. without consulting the staff side against the agreement between the Department and staff side, as referred to above. In spite of Member (Operations), as Chairperson in the meeting, assuring the staff side to review specific cases of merger against the spirit of the understanding, the staff side was not convinced in the meeting of 27-11-09 and thus the meeting ended only with a decision to continue dialogue on 28-11-09 (Saturday).

2. On 28-11-09 the discussion again start with merger of RMS offices and it was agreed upon between the official and the staff side that the agreement reached with the staff side will be followed in principle, with the stipulation to review the cases of Gaya and N.K. Ganj RMS offices. On the request of the staff side Member (O) agreed to depute CGM (Mail Business) to Bihar to review the functioning of RMS offices especially, in the context of quantum of mails and the mail being deposited as referred to by the staff side. No further progress could take place in regard to other items and it was decided to continue discussion on 30-11-2009 under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (Post).

3. On 30-11-09, the meeting started at 1100 hrs. under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (P). At the outset Secy. (P) made it very clear to the staff side that the Govt. has sanctioned Rs. 4000 crores to the Department for its transformation. The Chairperson also made it known to the staff side that all along there was a feeling that
