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ATROCITIES ON THE PART OF THE MANAGERS OF SPEED POST HUBS

Our CHQ is receiving numerous complaints from our members about the atrocities and irregularities on the part of the Managers, Speed Post Hubs-particularly from Chennai, Mumbai, Delhi and Kolkata.

In the Hubs of Chennai, Mumbai and Delhi, outsiders are employed nearly 60 to 70% and regular employees account for 30%. But the good news is that Kolkata Hub where our union is number one is running without employing single outsider.

All the four hubs are opening nearly 800 to 1000 bags daily and closing nearly 600 to 800 bags. 45000 to 55000 Speed Post articles are handled by these hubs. The cruel fact is that no cut-off time is fixed by the Management in these hubs. The bags are opened indiscriminately without fixing cut-off time.

The Directorate has fixed norms for Speed Post articles. But the orders of the Directorate have been thrown into wind by the Managers of these four hubs. This has resulted in missending of articles quite often and ultimately regular officials are made to face disciplinary action for no fault of theirs. Moreover, officials who retired

from the Department are also penalized on account of mistakes committed by outsiders.

When our union explained the above irregularities to the Management, they are not ready hear and further the Managers say that unions are spoiling the Speed Post business. In fact, delay of Speed Post articles, misending of articles and loss of articles are the outcome of the mismanagement on the part of the Managers. For instance, some outsiders who are unfit for the job but close to the Management are employed and they are commanding the regular employees. When the union brought this matter to the Management, the Management is supporting the outsiders continuously instead of regular employees. Of course many good outsiders are there in these hubs. But the policy of the CHQ is that we are always opposing the outsiders tooth and nail in the Speed Post hubs particularly.

Some of the Metro hubs were certified by ISO. We do not understand what is the need of obtaining ISO Certificate for doing public service. However whenever we visit Speed Post hubs, we observe that the hubs are functioning in the cramped

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accommodation. Under the pretext of modernization, the most of the hubs are designed as cabins with glass sheet. There is no proper ventilation and A/c machines kept are not functioning, showing A/c machines, fans are not fitted resulting in inconvenience and hardship to the officials working there.

The Managers turn deaf ears to the genuine grievances of staff but they are sitting in their chambers with all comforts seeing the CCTV. But the Managers are not finding any loss case through CCTV as on date. The purpose of installing CCTV in the office is to deduct the theft/loss cases and prevent chit-chat of officials who shrink work. Managers act like policeman after the employees whom they dislike.

OUR APPEAL TO MANAGEMENT :

Our CHQ is observing silent not because we are afraid of the reactions of the Managers but we do not want to spoil the Speed Post Business. Because this is the only business which competes couriers effectively till date.

Our silence should not be construed as weakness. If the things continue, the union will not hesitate to point out the irregularities and maladministration of the Managers openly.

OUR APPEAL TO ALL CIRCLE ADMINISTRATION :

The Circle administration is minding only the larger number of articles to be dealt with in Speed post hubs but they are not worried about the quality of service. The outsourcing of Speed Post hubs will ultimately bring in bad name to the Department by way of missending and loss of articles. Further this will lead to gradual losing of business from the public and customers. The doyens of the Department like Marathe and Mohinder singh accepted the cut off time for opening bags in Mail offices. This was in vogue for ensuring quality of service and not for favouring employees.

Circle administration must fix the cut-off time for each hub in respect of opening of bags. Now-a-days in Speed Post hub, one set is opening all the bags received by them and the other set is closing bags like ordinary mails. The Circle administration very well knows this but remains mute spectator. Because the Circle administration wants to show the target to the Directorate. Our plea to Circle administration is to observe the norms fixed by the Directorate. This will enhance quality of service.

Let us hope the administration will hear our genuine voice, or else we have no other alternative to resort to agitation to strengthen our Speed Post service.

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GOVERNMENT ORDERS

Closing of Central Government Offices in connection with general elections to the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies and Bye Elections to Legislative Assemblies during 2014.

O.M. No. 12/7/2014-JCA 2 dated 21st March, 2014 from Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions (Department of Personnel & Training).

The undersigned is directed to say that in connection with the general elections to the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies of Andhra Pradesh, Odisha & Sikkim and Bye Elections to the Legislative Assemblies of some states, scheduled to be held in 2014, the following guidelines, already issued by DOPT vide OM No. 12/14/99-JCA dated 10th October, 2001, have to be followed for closing of the Central Government Offices including Industrial Establishments in the States:

(i) The relevant offices/organizations shall remain closed on the day of poll in the notified areas where general elections to the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assembly are scheduled to be conducted.

(ii) In connection with bye-election to the State Assembly, only such of the employees who are bona-fide voters in the relevant constituency should be granted special casual leave on the day of polling. Special Casual Leave may also be granted to an employee who is ordinarily a resident of constituency and registered as a voter but employed in any Central Government Organization/Industrial Establishment located outside the constituency having a general /bye-election.

2. The above instructions may be brought to the notice of all concerned.

The undersigned is directed to say that vide its OM No. 6-1/2011.NS-II dated 04.03.2014 Ministry of Finance (DEA) has revised interest rates of Small Savings Schemes from 1st April 2014. Details about old and revised rates is given below:

• **Payment of Transport Allowance to Central Government Employees posted in offices located at Faridabad, Ghaziabad Gurgaon, and Noida -Order of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT), Principal Bench, New Delhi in O.A. No. 2080/2012 of ML Rustagi v/s Union of India & Others and 22 OAs (clubbed together) - Matter regarding.**

O.M. No. 211812010-EII (B) dated 7th March, 2014 from Ministry of Finance Department of Expenditure.

The undersigned is directed to refer to Order dated 4th October, 2013 of Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT), Principal Bench, New Delhi in O.A. No. 2080/2012 of ML Rustagi v/s Union of India & Others and 22 similar OAs (clubbed together) wherein Hon'ble CAT has directed the Ministry of Finance to re-examine the whole issue of payment

of Transport Allowance to Central Government Employees posted in offices located at Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon and Noida holistically taking into consideration its history starting from the issue of O.M. No.21 (1)/97-E-II(B) dated 3.10.1997, the various directions given by the Tribunal from time to time, the arguments advanced by the Applicants in all the OAs for grant of special dispensation to satellite towns with further direction that the decision taken is to be communicated to Ministries/Departments by means of a reasoned order.

2. Accordingly, as directed by Hon'ble CAT, the entire matter has been re-examined abinitio in this Ministry. It is stated that Central Government Employees posted in offices located at Faridabad, Gurgaon, Ghaziabad and Noida are eligible for Transport Allowance rates applicable to "Other Places" specified in Ministry of Finance P.M. No. 21 (21/2008-E-II (B) dated 29.08.2008 and NOT at 'A-1/A' class cities rates for the following reasons/ grounds:-

(a) The 'special dispensation' to certain localities, including Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, and Noida, in the matter of grant of House Rent Allowance (HRA) and City Compensatory Allowance (CCA) were allowed, as special cases, by means of separate orders issued during 1974 to 1990. The 'special dispensation' allowed grant of HRA & CCA at Delhi rates to employees posted in offices located in Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, and Noida. However, the 'special dispensation' was neither based on classification of Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, or Noida as 'A-1/A Class cities nor inclusion of any of these areas into Delhi (UA) for the purpose of HRA and CCA.

(b) The special dispensation in the matter of grant of HRA & CCA at rates applicable to 'A-1/A Class cities to certain localities including Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, and Noida has been continued till date in respect of HRA and till 31.08.2008 in the respect of CCA, by making explicit provisions in the order issued by the Ministry of Finance since 1993.

(c) The concept of Transport Allowance was introduced by the Fifth Central Pay Commission (5th CPC) to defray the cost of commuting between residence and office. The 5th CPC recommended grant of Transport Allowance @ Rs.800, Rs.400 and Rs.100 p.m. for 'A' class cities and Rs.400 Rs.200 and Rs.75 p.m. for remaining cities/towns

to be classified as 'Other Places'. The 5th CPC had not specified / recommended as to what should be the basis for classification of cities/towns as 'A-1/A class cities or Other Places for the purpose of Transport Allowance. On accepting the recommendation of 5th CPC, order for grant of Transport Allowance was issued vide Ministry of Finance O.M. No, 21 (1) 197-E-II(B) dated 3.10.1997. Though it was decided that the cities classified as 'A-1' and 'A' for the purpose of CCA shall be the same for grant of Transport Allowance also, however, it was not decided to extend the 'special dispensation' granted to CCA, in respect of certain localities including Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, and Noida, for Transport Allowance.

Clarification in this regard was issued at point No.9 of Ministry of Finance O.M. No.21 (1)/97-E-II(B) dated 22.02.2002 that the 'special dispensation' to some cities was extended in the case of HRA/CCA only, and that it was not applicable for Transport Allowance.

The issue of grant of Transport Allowance at higher rates to employees posted in offices located in Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon and Noida were raised in various OAs filed in CAT, in particular OA No. 1270/2005 which was disposed by Order dated 18.11.2005. OA No. 483/2005 along with OA No. 1292/2005 disposed by Order dated 16.09.2005 and OA No.2263/2005 disposed by Order dated 03.01.2006. The Order of CAT dated 16.09.2005 in OA No.483/2005 was challenged in the Delhi High Court and the matter was admitted as WP (C) No. 2600/2006 of ESIC & Others v/s Joint Action Council Speciality and Doctors wherein the Union of India is being represented through Secretary, Ministry of Labour and Employment. The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi is yet to decide the matter. Hence, the order of CAT allowing grant of Transport Allowance at 'A-1/A class cities to employees posted in offices located at Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon and Noida is, therefore, sub-judice.

The 6th CPC while recommending CCA to be subsumed in Transport Allowance, did not recommend any special dispensation to be given to any locality in the matter of grant of Transport Allowance. Orders on implementation of the recommendations of the 6th CPC were issued vide Ministry of Finance O.M. No. 21 (2)12008-EII (B) dated 29.08.2008 (effective from 01.09.2008) wherein higher rates of Transport Allowance were allowed to 'A-1/A' class cities and lower rates to 'Other Places'. The names of those 13 cities, to

which higher rates of Transport Allowance is admissible, have been explicitly mentioned therein, which do not include Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon or Noida. All cities/towns/ places other than those 13 specified cities, comes under the classification of 'Other places' for the purpose of admissibility of Transport Allowance. Moreover, Delhi (UA) classified as 'A-1' class city for CCA purpose does not include the areas of Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon and Noida.

3. Therefore, Transport Allowance to Central Government Employees posted in offices located at Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gurgaon and Noida should be regulated as per the rates applicable to 'Other Places' in terms Of Ministry of Finance O.O.M. No. 21 (2)12008-E.II (B) dated 29.8.2008.

• Declaration of Holiday on 14th April, 2014- Birthday of Dr.B.R. Ambedkar.

O.M. F. No.12/4/2014-JCA-2 dated 12th March, 2014 from Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions (Department of Personnel & Training)

It has been decided to declare Monday, the 14th April 2014, as a Closed Holiday on account of the birthday of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, for all Central Government Of-fices including Industrial Establishments throughout India.

2. The above holiday is also being notified in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881 (26 of 1881).

3. All Ministries/Departments of Government of India may bring the above decision to the notice of all concerned.

• Renewal of CGHS plastic cards in Delhi NCR - regarding.

O.M. No. S 11011/1112014-CGHS (P) dated 12th March, 2014 from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare CGHS (P)

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's O.M No. S11011/1/2014-CGHS (P) dated 10.02.2014 vide which fresh instructions were issued supplement-ing the existing guidelines on the issue of CGHS Plastic cards . In this regard attention is also drawn to this Ministry's O.M. No. Misc. 6024/2007/ CGHS (HQ)/CGHS(P) dated 27.12.2010 in respect of pensioner CGHS beneficiaries vide which it was clarified that :-

'The Plastic Cards (which are identity cards), would hereinafter be issued with validity till the pensioner beneficiary is entitled for CGHS benefits. In respect of pensioner CGHS beneficiaries, who have paid CGHS contribution for 'Rest of Life' CGHS facilities, the Plastic Cards would, hereinafter, be issued for 'Rest of Life'. The plastic cards already issued with a printed validity of five years to pensioner beneficiaries, who had paid CGHS contributions for 'Rest of Life' CGHS facilities, would be taken as valid for use for 'Rest of Life'. However, such CGHS pensioner beneficiaries have the option to obtain new plastic cards after five years, if they choose to do so.'

2. Accordingly, the CGHS pensioner beneficiaries have the option to apply for new CGHS plastic card which are now being issued with validity for 'whole life' printed on the plastic card itself. However, the serving employees are issued CGHS plastic cards with validity of five years and they are due for renewal every five years on expiry of validity period indicated on their CGHS plastic card. Fresh cards are being issued in place of old cards on regular basis. Since the applications are being received for renewal of old cards in a very large number, it has created bottle-neck and it is taking some time to issue fresh cards.

3. In light of the above, with a view to avoid inconvenience to the CGHS beneficiaries and to facilitate them in availing CGHS services, it has been decided to allow them to access CGHS facilities with the old cards for a further period of six months from the date of expiry of CGHS cards as indicated on their CGHS Plastic cards. However, they have to apply for renewal of CGHS plastic card in the prescribed Form as provided in this Ministry's OM dated 10.02.2014 as referred to above.

4. In this connection, it is clarified that the beneficiaries who have already submitted applications for renewal of CGHS cards on expiry of their validity period and have so far not received fresh CGHS cards, they will not be denied CGHS facilities, provided the beneficiary is entitled to CGHS benefits as per CGHS guidelines.

5. A CGHS beneficiary is required to apply for new CGHS plastic cards three months in advance or within six months of expiry of validity of the plastic cards and it is recommended to keep a copy of the same as a proof of submission of application for renewal of card which can be produced on demand

before the CGHS authorities, if required, for availing the CGHS benefits on the basis of old card.

6. CGHS Wellness Centres will provide the medical facilities to CGHS beneficiaries on the basis of old CGHS plastic card upto a maximum period of six months from the date of validity as indicated on the CGHS plastic card after due verification of the entitlement and validity of CGHS card as per CGHS data base.

7. The CGHS empanelled private hospitals / diagnostic centres are requested to provide the medical facilities on the basis of old card upto a maximum period of six months from the date of validity as indicated on the CGHS plastic card, subject to the condition that the CGHS beneficiary has submitted the application for renewal of CGHS plastic card, complete in all respect, to the CGHS card issuing authority.

8. This OM shall come into effect from the date of issue and will remain in force for one year or till further order, whichever is earlier.

• Payment of Dearness Allowance to Central Government employees - Revised Rates effective from 1.1.2014.

MINISTRY OF FINANCE O.M. NO. 1/1/2014.E-II(B) DATED 27TH MARCH, 2014.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's Office Memorandum No. 1-8/2013-E-II

(B) dated 25th September, 2013 on the subject mentioned above and to say that the President is pleased to decide that the Dearness Allowance payable to Central Government employees shall be enhanced from the existing rate of 90% to 100% with effect from 1st January, 2014.

2. The provisions contained in paras 3, 4 and 5 of this Ministry's O.M. No. 1 (3)/2008-E-II(B) dated 29th August, 2008 shall continue to be applicable while regulating Dearness Allowance under these orders.

3. The additional installment of Dearness Allowance payable under these orders shall be paid in cash to all Central Government employees.

4. The Payment of arrears of Dearness Allowance shall not be made before the date of disbursement of Salary of March 2014.

5. These orders shall also apply to the civilian employees paid from the Defence Services Estimates' and the expenditure will be chargeable to the relevant head of the Defence Services Estimates. In regard to Armed Forces personnel and Railway employees separate orders will be issued by the Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Railways, respectively.

6. In so far as the persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders issue in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India.

JUSTICE DELAYED BUT NOT DENIED

The Madras High Court upheld the CAT Chennai Judgment. Based on that, five RRR candidates have been absorbed as PA/ Postmen by the Tamilnadu Circle. The case of remaining 87 RRR candidates is still pending in the Madras High Court. Let us hope that the court will render suitable justice.
